About the College

St. Joseph's College for Women is a dream realization of the long-cherished desire of thousands of people in and around Gorakhpur U.P. It is located in the centre of the city close to the Railway station and near to Deen Dayal Upadhyay Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur. The college is affiliated to Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur and it was established in the year 2005 and is now a full-fledged multi faculty institute.

The college is under the management of Catholic Dioceses of Gorakhpur educational Society (Reg. No. 1401/84-85) a Christian minority society availing the minority rights guaranteed by the Indian Constitutions.

The vision of the college is “**Formation of emancipated and empowered women to be societal transformers through holistic educational leadership**”. The mission of the College corresponds to the vision and focuses on the creation of healthy and civilized society by forming trained, educated Humane women leaders who can very well nurture ideal families and can also contribute to the well-being of the nation at large.

Our college places a strong emphasis on providing adequate infrastructure facilities to support teaching and learning endeavours. Spanning across 3000 square meters of land, the campus accommodates two sturdy buildings dedicated to various academic pursuits. Established in 2005, the college initially offered undergraduate programs in B.A., B.Sc., and B.Ed. In 2018, it expanded its offerings to include an M.A. course in English Literature. The campus comprises several blocks, each catering to specific academic disciplines:
